ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Applicants for admission must possess a High School Diploma, High school Equivalency or GED to be considered eligible for admission to the program. All applicants must achieve a minimum passing score of 20 on the School's entrance exam. Classes are taught in English. The student must demonstrate the ability to read and write in standard English.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

Students must complete all areas of the program with a cumulative BPA of 75% or better and satisfactory complete the externship program in an approved medical facility. In addition, students must satisfy all financial obligations to the School to receive their certificates.


