ADMISSION POLICY

PURPOSE: To ensure that all potential students who are admitted into any program offered by Medical Career College of Northern California meet the school's admission requirements.

To ensure that all potential students show proof of proper documentation required for admission.

Academic Requirements

A potential student interested in enrolling in a program must complete the Application for Enrollment form. The applicant must meet and interview with school administrators prior to enrolling to ensure that they meet the minimum requirements for continuing the enrollment process. To be considered eligible for enrollment, the following requirement must be met:

- All applicants must be 18 years of age (under 18 years of age must have parent or guardian's approval)
- A High School Diploma*; OR
- Have a recognized equivalent of a High School Diploma: (e.g. GED)*
- Pass the school's entrance exam the Wonderlic with a score of 20 or better.
Those interested in enrolling in the hybrid program must score a minimum of 23 on the Wonderlic
- Pass the school's Spatial Acuity Test with a minimum score of 6
- Provide documentation of eligibility to work in the United States
- Demonstrate the ability to read and write in standard English**

The school does not discriminate against a student for reason such as race, gender, age, ethnicity, sexual preference or religion.

The school do not participate under the Ability to Benefit criteria.

Admission Testing

All applicants are required to take and pass the school's entrance exam, the Wonderlic, with a minimum score of 20 and the Spatial Acuity Test with a minimum score of 6.

Those interested in enrolling in the hybrid program must score a minimum of 23 on the Wonderlic.

The tests will be administered and scored in accordance with the tests providers recommendations. Every effort will be made to provide a quiet, comfortable environment for the student to take the tests. A student who does not receive a passing score on the entrance tests may return in 2 weeks to retest. If a passing score is not obtained on the second try, the student will not be allowed to enroll. The tests results are recorded as either pass or fail.

Students enrolling in the Limited Permit X-ray Technician program, must have completed, or be in the process of completing a medical assisting program. Student may also enroll in this program if they have a minimum of 2 years experience in a related field. All applicants will be assessed on an individual basis.
