Procedure

The safety of the students, faculty and staff at Medical Career College is our highest priority. The overall goal of the Medical Career College Emergency Preparedness Plan is to provide MCCNC students and staff with a comprehensive emergency management operation, which will provide reasonable levels of protection necessary for life, property, and the safety of its students and employees.

The effectiveness of any emergency preparedness and crisis management program is based on the level of training and the readiness of staff and students. This training program covers, at a minimum, the following elements:

Emergency Response to:

- Bloodborne Pathogens and infectious Disease
- Excessive Amounts of Radiation Exposure
- Armed Subject or Hostage
- Bomb Threats
- Chemical Accidents and Hazardous Materials
- Fire or Arson
- Severe Weather
- Utility Failure
- Students Who May Represent a Potential Threat to others
- Medical Emergencies

**Crime, Accident & Incident Forms**

Crime, accident, and/or incident report forms are kept in the school office. Those involved in or witnessing accidents, emergencies, incidents, or crimes should fill out the proper forms. When required, the school will notify appropriate authorities such as 911, fire, police, or medical personnel. The school is not responsible for decisions made by any of these agencies. **Every effort will be made to contact the students nearest relative regarding any emergency.** Staff and students are encouraged to update any emergency information should it arise.

Standard precautionary procedures are followed in the event of an accidental stick and/or possible contamination of a student with bio-hazardous materials. Instructors are well versed in the procedures. All visitors, personnel, and students are reminded not to leave personal belongings unattended. MCCNC is not responsible for any loss of property.
